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Event Report

Date of Event: 15th July 2023

Activity: Outbound Training for second semester MBA students.

Write up on the event:

Any outbound training is aimed at bringing out experiential learning to the intended audience. In the case of students, it is known to hone skills such as communication, teamwork, leadership, interpersonal trust, and problem solving apart from bringing about bonding. All these are needed to develop professional competencies in individuals, students and professionals alike. Keeping this in mind, the Department of MBA, NCET decided to expose its second semester students to a unique one-day outbound training at GK Hill View resort, Kaiwara. Kaiwara, though a nondescript town in Chkkaballapur has reference in the Mahabharatha as a place that had provided residence to the Pandavas during exile as well as home to the famous Yogi Narayana mutt.

Once the students had assembled after the welcome formalities, they were initially subjected to a tug of war. This was a test of their physical strength and it served as a unique icebreaker. After a sumptuous lunch, students were allowed to explore the facilities at the resort as well as bask in the nature that was welcoming and favourable for this outing. While few students choose to "hit the pool", to either swim or play water polo, some tried their hand at indoor games. A high tea was organized and after the customary commemorative photographs, the outbound training culminated at around 5.30 PM.

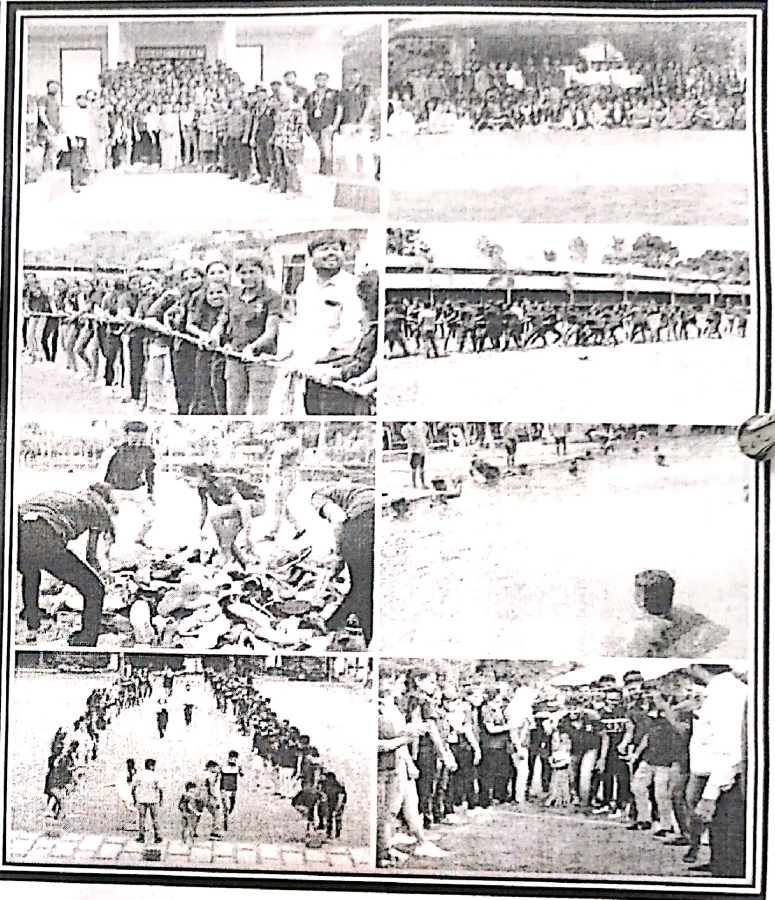
