Memorandum of Understanding

This memorandum of Understanding is hereby executed on this 20-Nov-2020 between **Anudip Foundation for Social Welfare**, having its head office at Cimcys Towers, 3rd Floor, Plot No Y-13, Block-Ep, Sector-V, Salt Lake City, Ps: Bidhan Nagar (East), Kolkata-700091 (representing Bangalore Center, #224, 1st & 2nd floor, 14th Cross, Sampige Road, Malleswaram, Bangalore- 560003) and **Nagarjuna College of Engineering & Technology, #38/36, Ramagondanahalli, Yelahanka Bangalore- 560064.**

Background of Anudip Foundation:

Anudip Foundation for Social Welfare, set up in 2007, is a Section 8 non-profit company as per Companies Act, 2013 having its head office at Vishnu Chambers, 2nd floor, J4, Block GP, Sector-V, Salt Lake, Kolkata-700091. Anudip creates livelihood opportunities for marginalized women and youth of Eastern India.

Over the past 11 years Anudip has worked with international and national agencies, government units, corporations and community based organizations to offer sustainable livelihood programs for disadvantaged groups residing in the rural and semi-urban Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Delhi NCR, Odisha, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Telengana, Assam, Meghalaya and West Bengal. Anudip aims at improving the socio-economic status of these people and locality by developing their employability and entrepreneurial skills for IT-enabled jobs.

Program Deliverable:

To impart market aligned skill development and training program for **50+ students** on a Pilot Basis for onwards successful training and Placements for participating students. As the program will have only objective to secure reputed jobs for the students and invite students from final year graduates. So that they can participate in jobs coming to them. We will closely evaluate the success of this batch before we plan and implement further batches. Apart from this pilot, in case of future batches, clauses might change as per our mutual understanding.

Curriculum:

The sector-specific job-oriented skills require special curriculum built to enhance students' employability skills. Anudip's curriculum team works at developing and adding new components to the customized curriculum based on the market demand and job requirement.

These following modules would be included in the course curriculum

1. DDM : Diploma in Digital Marketing (Eligibility- MBA Final Year)

Class Schedule:

Anudip would impart training to each batch of students 3 day a week (Except Sundays) for each batch the **students have to come to our institute for both Theory and Lab oriented classes**. But due to Pandemic Situation, 70% classes will be conducted online and for the lab sessions they have to come to our center or in your college premises where our trainer will come and take the lab sessions, using your infrastructure. Total training period for each batch of students would be for as per stipulated hours in our course schedule. Anudip being a digital skills organization, has a well-developed curriculum and can be effectively delivered by our faculty on online mode.

Course Fees:

A nominal of Rs. ~~4000/-~~ ^{500/-} per program, but based on the request, only for this pilot 50+ students, we are providing this program free of cost. For future batches the course fees will be chargeable as per the norms.

Beneficiaries' Profile:

Minimum age for the target group is 18 years and maximum age is 24 years. Only Degree completed students or final year who are eligible for placements and final exams in 2021 MAR-APR-MAY. Final Year appearing students will not be eligible for the program as each students has to compulsorily join the jobs after placements. Students with access to minimum 1 Smart phone at home or Laptop and internet connection are eligible for this training.

Training Methodology:

Anudip's digital livelihoods program follows a technology-driven, blended learning methodology that has evolved based on employer and student feedback, team evaluation, and impact studies conducted externally and internally. Anudip team continuously tries to align with changing job markets, digital trends, employer demand, and the state of the training technology worldwide. Anudip utilizes its multimedia and game based learning programs which allows them to retain the learnings more effectively. This industry-aligned digital skills training program will train these youth through customized and digitized multimedia content in video, audio, presentation, and game formats, which will enable students to be attracted to and enjoy their classroom experience.



- Pre-Screening and Fitment test will be taken before enrolling the students
- There will be 3 assessment, to be taken by Anudip. Base term, Mid term and Final term.
- All the assessment will be taken in the presence of Anudip invigilator.
- 80% attendance is mandatory for the students to appear in Final assessment. And that will be the responsibility of the college.

Training location:

Keeping the current situation in mind, now we are providing online classes initially, but as soon as the situation will be recovered, we will provide the physical training on center or at your premises with proper infrastructure. Till then the essential lab session will be conducted on center or at your college with maintaining proper hygiene and social distancing and the theory session will be done through online.

Student Exit Profile:

Placement is a continuous process and every students will be given **3 valid opportunities** to appear for interviews and secure placements / jobs. In case a student is unable to secure a job within 3 opportunities, will be reconsidered once **70% of the students** have been placed from that particular batch. Average salary at entry level for a Graduate will depend on the program, job role and eligibility of the students.

Anudip has been able to successfully build relationships across diversified sectors starting from IT / ITES / Digital Services, E commerce, BFSI, Retail, Accounting etc. This primarily depends on the course eligibility / job role criteria prescribed by the industry as well as specified in Anudip's curriculum outline.

Termination:

Either party may terminate this Memorandum of Understanding by giving 15 days' prior notice.

Complementary support to the partner institute –

A no cost / free placement drive (DISHA) to be implemented by Anudip inside the campus or digitally where in any students from the partner institute can participate.

Benefits to the students:

- **Employment linked curriculum** designed and approved by top hiring partners / corporates
- **Experiencing high end IT and Digital programs** in very nominal fees vis-a-vis market offering by for profit training organization
- **Effective uses of in-house developed technologies** like CMIS, for monitoring and LMS.

- Enguru - A software platform where each student has to go through self-learning and has to complete 160 level of English tests inclusive of placement test.
- Online classes through centralized shared Google Meet (Corporate version).

- Monitoring of attendance and class effectiveness through backend data. Dedicated Quality check team.
- 100 percent placement support through dedicated corporate relations team nationally.
- Volunteering sessions from TOP corporates on concurrent market and corporate scenario as well as student alignment as per market aligned skills.
- Certificate to the students with Anudip and NSDC







**MoU between Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi and Malaysian
Qualifications Agency on Mutual Recognition of Equivalence of the
Educational Qualifications**

This Memorandum of Understanding is signed between the Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi, India and the Malaysian Qualifications Agency, Malaysia on Mutual Recognition of Equivalence of Educational Qualifications.

The Association of Indian Universities and the Malaysian Qualifications Agency, hereinafter referred as "the Parties", being desirous of strengthening educational exchanges and cooperation between the two countries agree upon recognition of educational qualifications, on mutual basis in accordance with the following articles:

ARTICLE 1

Both the Parties undertake to mutually recognize as equivalent the qualifications awarded by the duly approved/recognised/accredited universities/higher educational institutions in the Republic of Indian and the accredited qualifications awarded by duly approved universities/institutions in Malaysia, in the disciplines of Humanities, Natural Science, Social Sciences, Engineering and Technology, Commerce and Business Administration and Agriculture provided that such qualifications/degrees have been awarded in accordance with the national policy, regulation and laws of the country concerned.

ARTICLE 2

Both the Parties shall mutually recognize the certificates of completion of Senior Secondary Education called "Sijil Tinggi Pelajaran Malaysia (STPM)" awarded by the duly approved/recognised Board/System of Education in Malaysia and the Senior Secondary/Higher Secondary/Pre University/Intermediate examination awarded by the duly approved/recognised Board in India, as equivalent to Grade 12 Examination and that the persons holding such qualifications shall be eligible for admission for study in the undergraduate programmes provided they fulfil the eligibility requirements, as prescribed for various undergraduate programmes.

ARTICLE 3

Both the Parties shall mutually recognize the 3-4 year "BACHELOR DEGREE" (pursued under 10+2+3-4 or 12+3-4 year system of education) awarded by the duly approved/recognised/accredited universities/higher educational institutions in the Republic of India and the accredited qualifications awarded by duly approved universities/institutions in Malaysia as equivalent to the corresponding degree in the appropriate field.

ARTICLE 4

Both the Parties shall mutually recognize the 4-year "BACHELOR DEGREE" in Engineering and Technology (pursued under 10+2+4 or 12+4 year system of education) awarded by the duly approved/recognised/accredited universities/higher educational institutions in the Republic of India and the accredited qualifications awarded by duly approved universities/institutions in Malaysia as equivalent to the corresponding degree in the appropriate field. Rules and regulations of the respective professional bodies in each other's country will apply for the purpose of employment.

ARTICLE 5

Both the Parties shall mutually recognize "MASTER DEGREES" (pursued under 10+2+3-4+2 or 12+3-4+2 year system of education) awarded by the duly approved/recognised/accredited universities/higher educational institutions in the Republic of India and the accredited qualifications awarded by duly approved universities/institutions in Malaysia as equivalent to the corresponding degree in the appropriate field.

ARTICLE 6

Both the parties shall mutually recognize "MASTER DEGREE in Engineering and Technology (pursued under 10+2+4+2 or 12+4+2 Year system of education) awarded by the duly approved/recognised/accredited universities/higher educational institutions in the Republic of India and the accredited qualifications awarded by duly approved universities/institutions in Malaysia as equivalent to the corresponding degree in appropriate field. Rules and regulations of the respective professional bodies in each other's country will apply for the purpose of employment.

ARTICLE 7

Both the Parties shall mutually recognize the "DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY" degree awarded by the duly approved/recognised/accredited universities/higher educational institutions in the Republic of India and the accredited qualifications awarded by duly approved universities/institutions in Malaysia as equivalent to the corresponding degree in the appropriate field.

ARTICLE 8

Both the Parties shall mutually recognize the "DOCTOR OF LITERATURE" degree (D.Litt) awarded by the duly approved/recognised/accredited universities/higher educational institutions in the Republic of India and the accredited qualifications awarded by duly approved universities/institutions in Malaysia as equivalent to the corresponding degree in the appropriate field.

ARTICLE 9

Both the Parties shall establish a joint technical committee for the purpose of exchanging information and consulting each other about changes in the education system of their countries. Both the Parties will also regularly monitor the implementation of this MoU. Any change in the name of Academic Degrees/Titles and conditions of award be intimated, and may entail to the revision of the MoU. The specific terms of reference and membership of the aforementioned committee shall be discussed and agreed upon between the parties.

ARTICLE 10

This MoU will not give rise to any financial obligation by one Party to the other. Each Party will bear its own cost and expenses in relation to this MoU.

ARTICLE 11

Notwithstanding anything contained in this MoU, where the implementation of this MoU affects any Party's rights and interests with respect to its national security, national and public interest or public order, protection of intellectual property rights, confidentiality and secrecy of documents, information and data, the Party may undertake appropriate steps or consultations to ensure that its rights and interests are protected and safeguarded.

ARTICLE 12

The MoU come into force on the date of signing and shall remain in force for Five years and will be automatically extended for a further Five years, unless one of the parties declares its intention to terminate the MoU by written declaration before six months of the ending of the MoU. Either party can, during the duration of the MoU, terminate the MoU by giving six months' notice.



Nagarjuna College of Engineering & Technology in Bengaluru, was started in the year 2001, and is located at Nagarjuna College of Engineering & Technology, Mudugurki, Venkatagiri Kote Post, Devanahalli, Bengaluru- 562 164 (hereinafter referred to as "NCET") was established under the guidance of Nagarjuna Education Society (NES) in 1995. NCET offer courses accredited by NAAC with A Grade, affiliated to VTU, approved by AICTE and accredited by NBA and is one of the most reputed institutes offering Engineering courses at the undergraduate and graduate level in the country.

AND

cBalance Solutions Pvt. Ltd., an Indian corporation, with its registered office at Plot 350-A, 202, Joy Apartments, 21st Road, Bandra, Mumbai 400050 hereinafter referred to as "cBalance", is a knowledge-centric solutions hub that specializes in Tool Building and Strategy Development for integrating Carbon ERP into institutional process and enabling measurable, reportable, and verifiable GHG Emissions, Energy, Water and Waste Mitigation. It has been appointed as UNEP expert for developing Low-Carbon Development Roadmaps and is also a BEE Certified Energy Auditor.

NCET and cBalance may be referred to herein individually as a 'party' and collectively as the 'parties'

Whereas the two parties are desirous in entering into an agreement to disseminate knowledge amongst students about techniques, tools and technologies that promote energy efficiency in the building construction and the indoor cooling sector with a view to mitigate the climate change impacts caused by direct and indirect GHG emissions from these industry sectors.

Activity I – Capacity Building for Refrigeration Air Conditioning (RAC) Professors

1.01 A three-day workshop will be arranged for RAC professors from all interested colleges in Bengaluru, along with Board members of RAC Syllabus Planning Committee of the Visvesvaraya Technological University. The aim of the workshop will be two fold: 1) training college professors on the basic science and engineering principles of sustainable cooling technologies (SCTs), and use of building energy simulation software (ASHRAE's SmartEnergy) for classroom teaching and project assignments, and 2) Co-creating revised lesson plans for the subject to include SCTs and training on pedagogy aids and techniques to be employed for teaching in accordance with the co-created lesson plans.

1.02 cBalance will prepare the training material and conduct the workshop pro-bono, and will require the college to make logistical arrangements for the workshop.

Activity II - Augmenting existing RAC Course Lesson Plans to formally integrate SCT's related modules without altering University Curricula

2.01 An exhaustive training and lesson plan-development workshop exclusively for RAC Professors from NCET to provide deeper handholding and support in continuation of the general Professor's Workshop (Activity I) with the goal of acutely enhancing technical and pedagogy capacity related to energy efficient and sustainable cooling technologies. The workshop will also lead to generation of a implementable lesson-plan and calendar of monitoring/support calls co-created with college professors, in recognition of the specific context prevalent at the college, and while adhering to existing Curricula prescribed by the University.

2.02 Lesson plans developed by professors will include SCT Modelling Project Assignments for the RAC Course which are to be conducted by students using sophisticated heat-load modelling

softwares developed by Indian Society of Heating Refrigerating Air Conditioning Engineers (ISHRAE).

2.03 Suitable Energy Software will be used for the training.

2.04 Students will be invited to participate in an Annual Sustainable Cooling Modelling Competition organized by 'Smart Energy' and student crafting the most accomplished Sustainable Cooling Modelling Project will receive an Employment Offer from 'Smart Energy'.

2.05 Subsequent to the workshop, cBalance will provide NCET's professors unrestricted access to its Talent & Knowledge Portal (www.fairconditioning.org) which will contain Pedagogy Teaching Aids including training presentations, video-recordings of SCT lectures, animations useful for Professors to explain science and engineering principles of SCTs.

2.06 Subsequent to successful use of the Smart Energy Software, by Students of NCET, for executing SCT Modelling Projects as part of the revised RAC Course Lesson Plan, cBalance will provide Certificates of Excellence to Students (certified by ISHRAE and Alliance for an Energy Efficient Economy) and permit students to apply for fulfilling employment opportunities available through its Talent & Knowledge Portal, and upload their Resume's for seeking opportunities from SCT Consultant and Manufacturing Companies.

Activity III – Ecosystem & University Board-of-Studies Advocacy

3.01 Following successful integration of SCT Modules into RAC Course Lesson Plans (as evidenced by Smart Energy Modelling Projects conducted by Students), NCET's pioneering efforts towards Curricula Integration will be exhaustively documents and widely disseminated amongst relevant peer, professional, community networks, and the University Board of Studies.

3.02 As part of this activity, cBalance will organize a Roundtable meet for Principals and Heads of Regional Colleges affiliated with the University, SCT Manufacturers, and Members of the Smart and Sustainable Space Cooling Coalition (such as ISHRAE, AEEE, Prayas Energy Group etc.). At this Roundtable, NCET will be given abundant opportunities to showcase its pioneering Curricula Integration Effort. cBalance will upload and widely disseminate the NCET SCT Integration Case Study and showcase efforts of its Professors and Management's pioneering efforts through its Talent & Knowledge Portal and Social Media Outreach efforts.

3.03 The College Management's unstinting support for the imperative need for including SCTs in the University's RAC Curriculum will be conveyed to the Syllabus Planning Committee of the Board of Studies of Mumbai University through a formal written submission that will be signed by the relevant College Authorities along with corresponding peers of other Academic Institutions who follow the University's Syllabus.

3.04 As part of this activity, if deemed relevant, NCET will nominate cBalance as an Industry Expert on the Syllabus Planning Committee of the Board of Studies.

Term and Termination

The Term of this Agreement (the "Term") will begin on the Effective Date and will continue in full force and effect for a period of one(1) years from the Effective Date. Thereafter, the Agreement may be renewed upon the mutual consent of the Parties. Either Party may terminate this Agreement with or without cause, at any time with thirty (30) days advance written notice, unless earlier terminated pursuant to this section. This Agreement shall automatically terminate upon the expiration or termination.

This Agreement (1) may not be assigned by either party without the prior written consent of the other, (2) may not be changed or modified orally or through a course of dealing, but only by a written amendment or revision signed by the parties, and (3) constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter thereof, superseding any previous or contemporaneous representations, understandings or agreements with respect thereto. Except as otherwise mutually agreed in writing in advance, neither party will make any media release or other public announcement relating or referring to this Agreement without the other's prior written consent.





This Agreement Regarding LabVIEW Academy Program ("Agreement") is made by and between Nagarjuna College of Engineering and Technology, having an address at Mudugurki Village, Near Mudugurki Railway Gate, Venkatagiri kote Post - 562154, Devanahalli (Tq), Bengaluru ("Institution") and NI Systems (India) Private Limited ("NI"), having an address at 81/1 & 82/1, Salarpur Software Zone, Wing B, 5th Floor, Block A, Bellandur, Varthur Hobli, Bangalore - 560 103, Karnataka, India, effective as of 1st February 2017 (the "Effective Date"). For good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Institution Courses.** Institution warrants and represents that it is a degree-granting educational institution. 

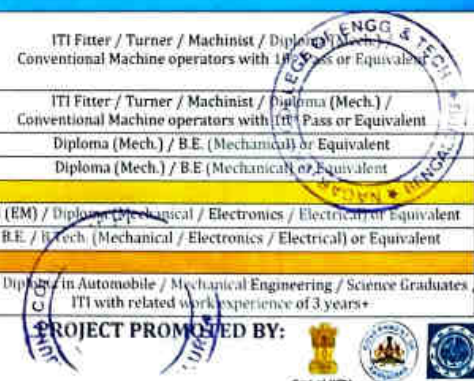



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING/ AGREEMENT




